The adverse impacts of these natural hazards is compounded by the low socio-economic condition of a large segment of their population. Volunteer organizations play a very large role in disaster preparation, response and recovery.

I learned a great deal from my participation in this exercise. I found it particularly impressive that a country so prone to natural disasters would place such a high value and rely so heavily on their volunteer responders. I am certain I learned more than I imparted from this experience. My greatest "takehome" was an even greater appreciation for the role our volunteers will play following a large disaster.

LTC COL Rezaul Hassan of the Bangladesh Army (a man who has responded to several large disasters) reemphasized to me that any disaster plan that does not include the use of well trained volunteers is doomed to fail.
